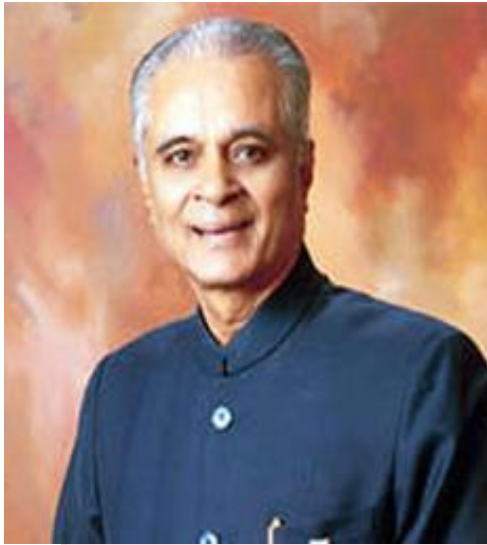
“Kaleidoscope Symbiosis Kindergarten”

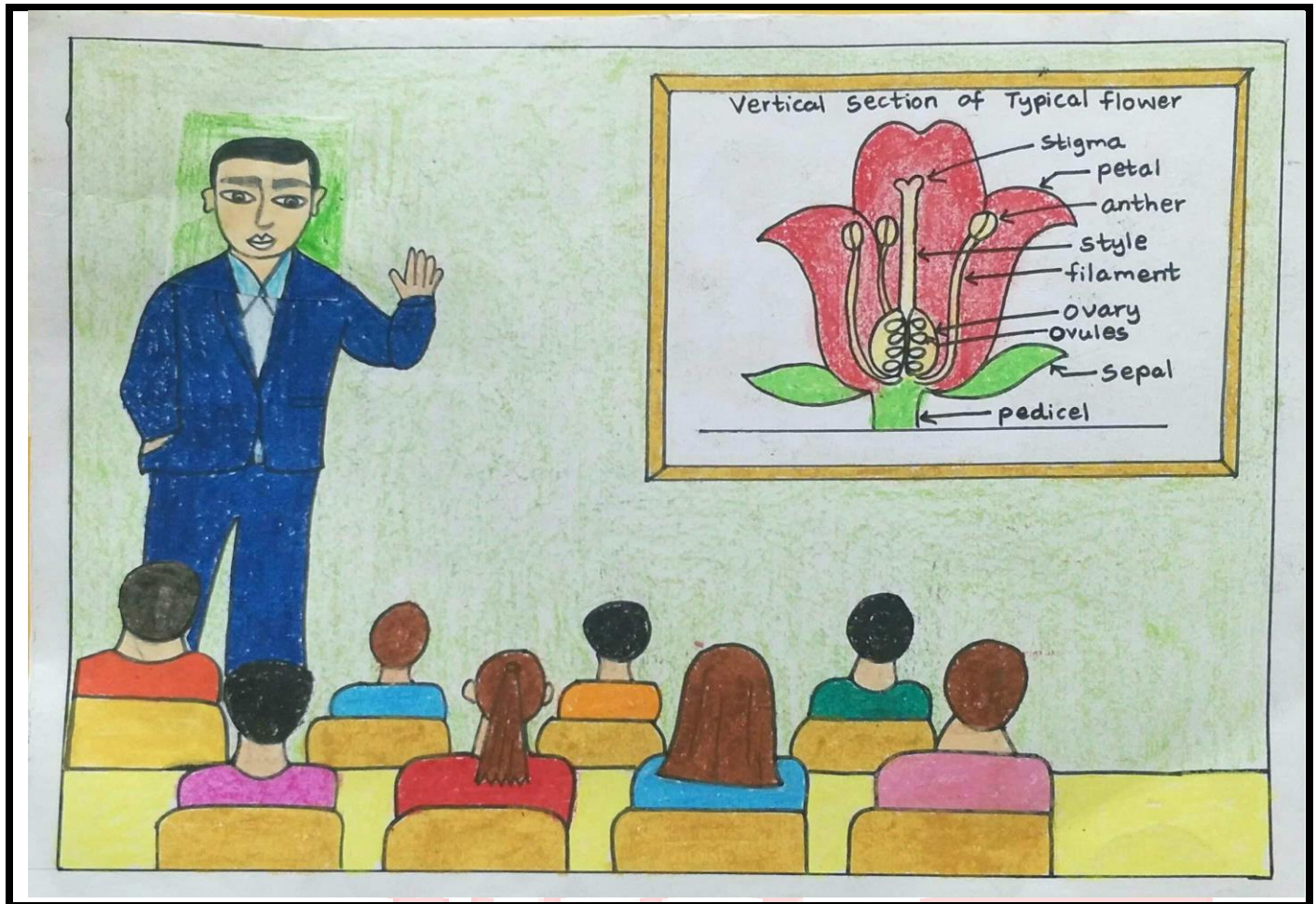

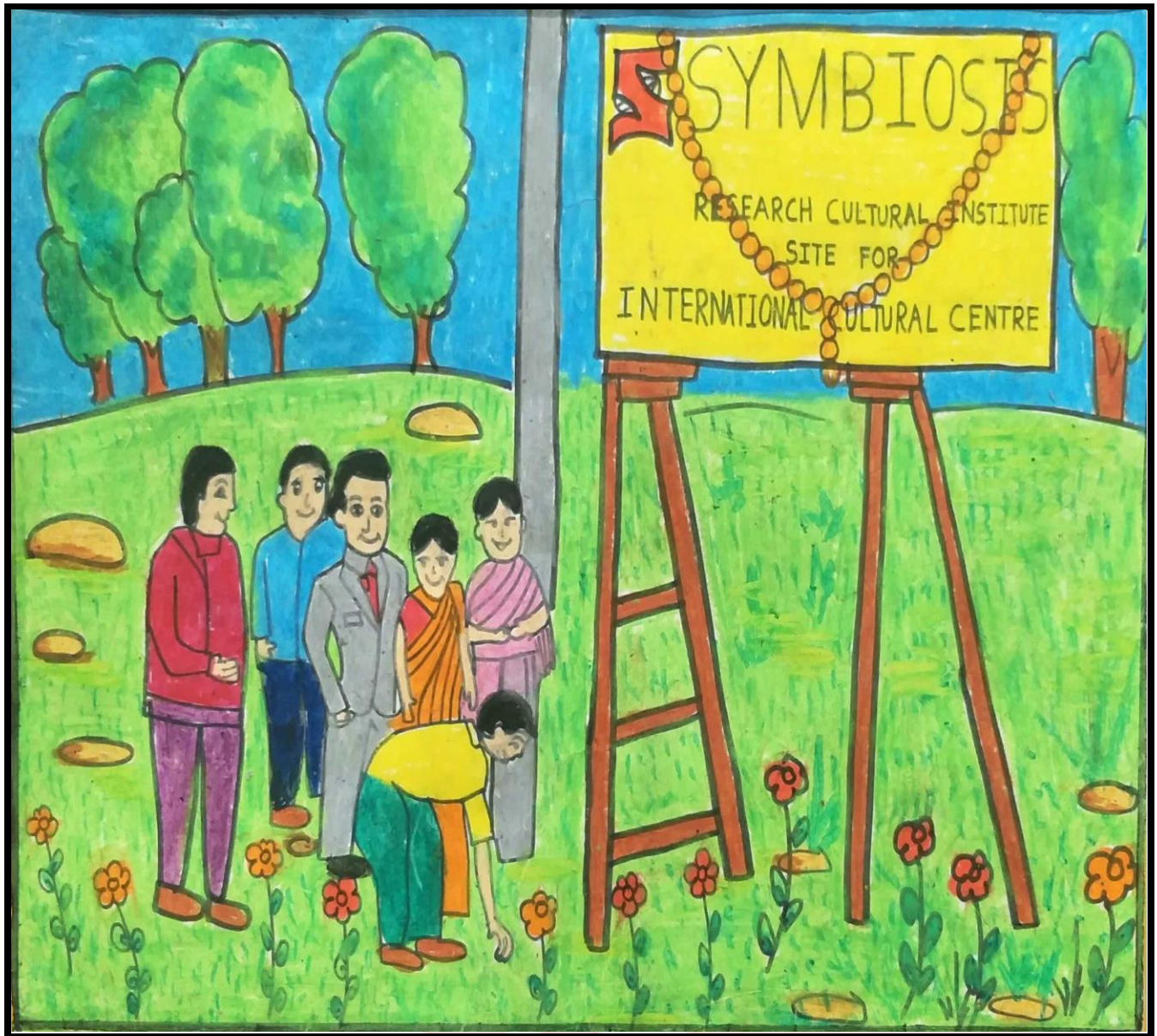

Sir decided to do something for these students. He started approaching and interacting with as many foreign students as possible from in and around Pune to understand their difficulties.

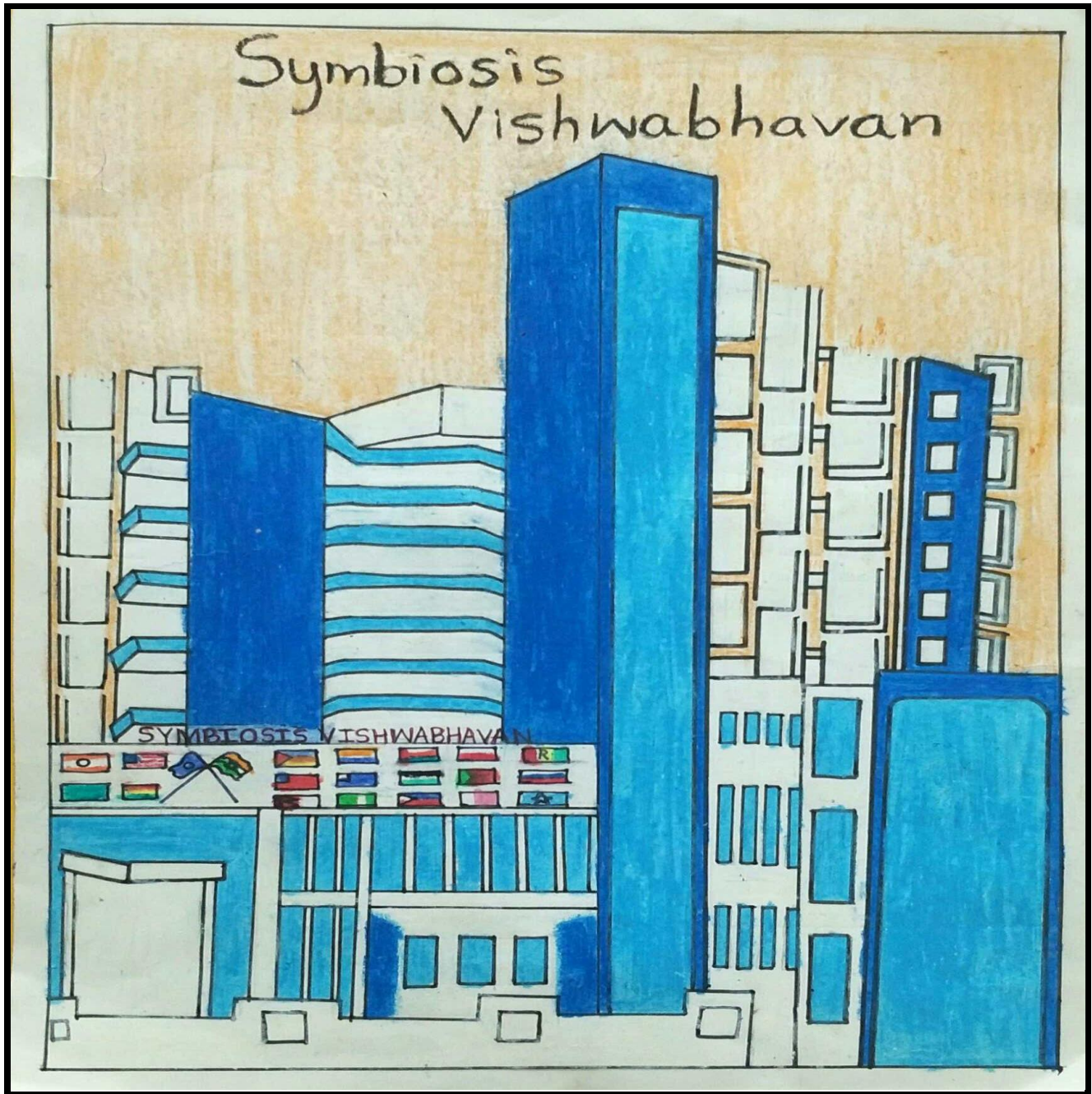
Sir realized that education is the best medium to bring together the young students from different countries who will be world's future citizens. So, he thought of 'Symbiosis' educational institution.



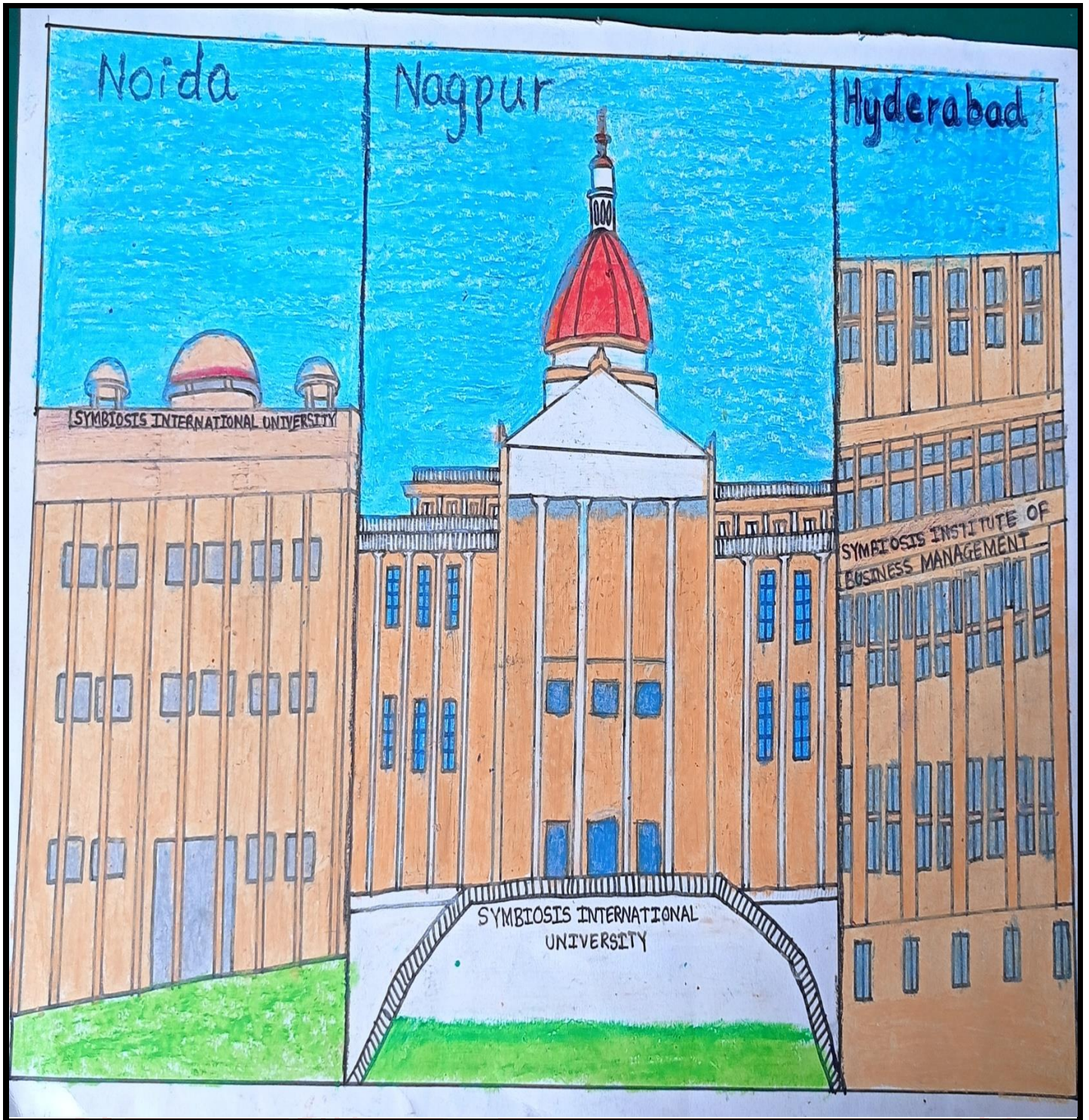
'Symbiosis' was thus born on 26th January 1971 for understanding, respecting and supporting foreign students in India, thus making India proud, and making attempt to bring the world together.

Experience 2 at Symbiosis Kindergarten

After the annual function and Christmas vacation, the first outdoor activity for Children was painting kites for Sankranti festival.

And activity teacher had prepared mushroom shaped kites for Mini K.G., Parachute shaped kites for Jr. K.G. and spaceship for Sr. K.G.

So all the Children painted their kites very well. But there was a specific pattern seen in maximum number of Sr. K.G. C class kite paintings.

What we noticed was that many Children had drawn the Indian flag on the spaceship shaped kite whereas even in Sr. K.G.A and B class none of them had done this. We knew this had something to do with what Sr. K.G. C class is specifically exposed to. But we were not understanding what was it? And after lot of contemplation we realized that Sr. K.G. C had their annual function theme (performed in December 2019) as 'India in space-ISRO' and very naturally the theme was fresh in their minds when they were doing the first activity after the event and it reflected in their work. In their annual function the class had showcased about many space activities by 'ISRO' like 'Mangalyaan', 'Chandrayaan'- 1 and 2. So when they got a picture of spaceship to paint they naturally showed an inclination to apply what they had recently learnt. Such learning happens in direct or subtle ways. It can differ from class to class and even individually. So it remains the crucial responsibility of school and home to provide rich experiences and facilitate and escalate learning from the Children's perspective.

Learning happens knowingly and unknowingly.

It exhibits the strong power of Children to internalize, recall and reproduce what they experienced, so rich experiences do matter!

The themes of Sr. K.G.A and B during the same annual function were 'The Saga of Mount Everest' and 'Kargil War – Remembering our heroes'. All the children of all the three classes Sr.KG A, B and C had thoroughly enjoyed performing these skits during annual function and had had happy learning.
